


# MEMBER SPOTLIGHT MRS. SABRINA BERRY

Growing Boldly: A journey of love, learning and Laughter

When I look back at the tapestry of my life, it's woven with vibrant threads of love, laughter, and lessons—many of which began the day I married Sundeep. Like many of us, I was a young bride, full of dreams and innocence, stepping into a world I barely understood but was eager to embrace.

Sundeep, my anchor and my guide, shaped me in ways I only came to appreciate overtime. With his quiet strength, endless patience, and unwavering support, he nurtured the woman I am meant to be. He never imposed, only encouraged. He molded me gently, never stifling my spirit but helping it soar. The early days were filled with discoveries, some



hilarious in hindsight. I still chuckle at the memory of calling the Commanding Officer "Uncle," much to Sundeep's horror. And walking into IMA hall where everybody stood up thinking the Commandant was entering only to see Sundeep and me sauntering in (no backdoor entry), followed by the General!! Good Lord!!

And then there was the infamous chole dinner, lovingly cooked by me, praised by his course mates, to realize later that I hadn't boiled the chana. Coming from a non-vegetarian household I didn't know it needed to be put in a pressure cooker after soaking overnight. But today, I can cook just about anything under the sun. Public speaking, a must do as an Army wife. From Ladies Club meetings to AWWA events and school functions, I found my voice. I may still put my foot in my mouth now and then, but I speak with confidence, something Sundeep always encouraged. He taught me to stand my ground, to speak my truth, and assured me he'd always be by my side (he might have regretted this later!!)

Sundeep was deployed in the Kargil War. He came home a warrior, battle scarred but strong, his spirit unshaken and yet, when he held my hand again, he was simply my husband. The man whose strength wasn't just measured in resilience, but in the quiet way he loved, in the steadiness of his presence. Yet another battle awaited him, one without weapons, one without uniforms. This fight was longer, harder, more relentless than anything before... Cancer is merciless, but so was his determination.

Seven years, filled with pain, hospitals, chemo, radiation, love, laughter, and defiance against time itself. He never once complained. Not when the weight of exhaustion settled into his bones, not when the treatments chipped away at his

body. Instead, he embraced every moment. He chose life, not in its frailty, but in its fullness. We traveled, we gathered friends and family, we refused to let the ticking clock dictate the way we lived. I stayed by his side as he had always been by mine. Through every trial, through every moment of strength and vulnerability, he remained unwavering. And when the fight finally ended in June 2023, he did not lose—not truly. Because how could someone lose when they had

lived so fully, so fiercely?

His bravery was not just in fighting, but in loving, in choosing joy, in standing tall even when the ground beneath him trembled. Our life together has been a roller coaster,



but with more highs than lows. And for that, I am deeply grateful. Through every twist and turn, Sundeep has been my constant—my partner, my teacher, my best friend and my love always. This month is hard. It carries the echoes of his laughter, the shadow of his absence. But if there's one thing he taught me, it's that love endures, strength is quiet but powerful, and



it's in the way we live despite them.

And so, I carry him with me. In the stories, in the memories, in the way I continue forward. Because love, like his, never truly fades.
